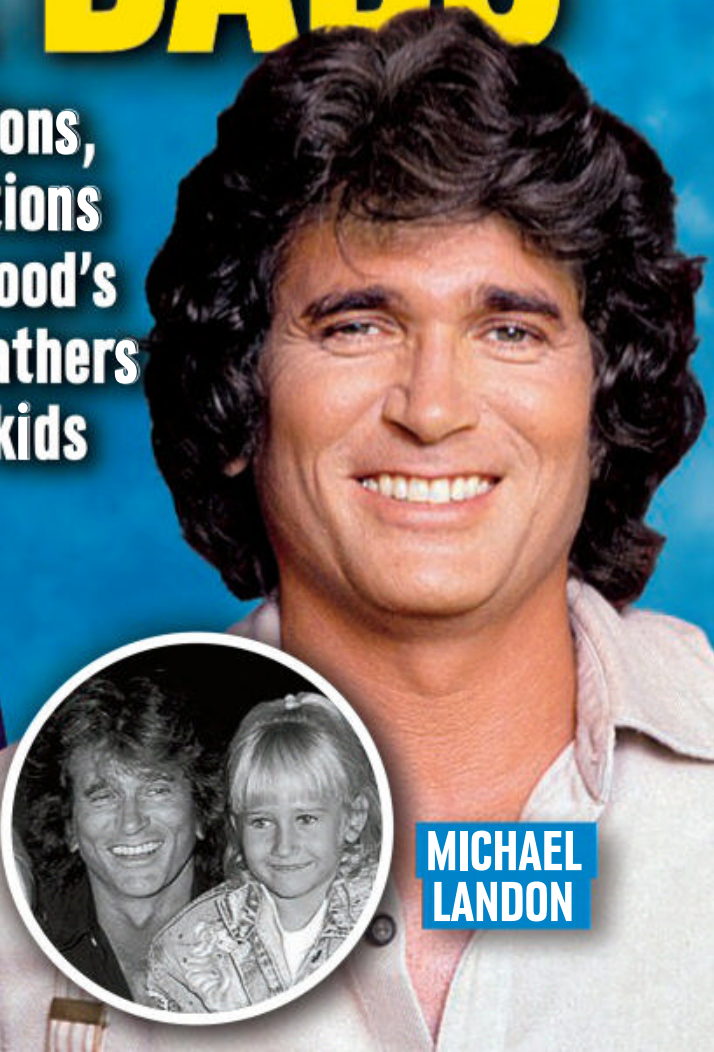

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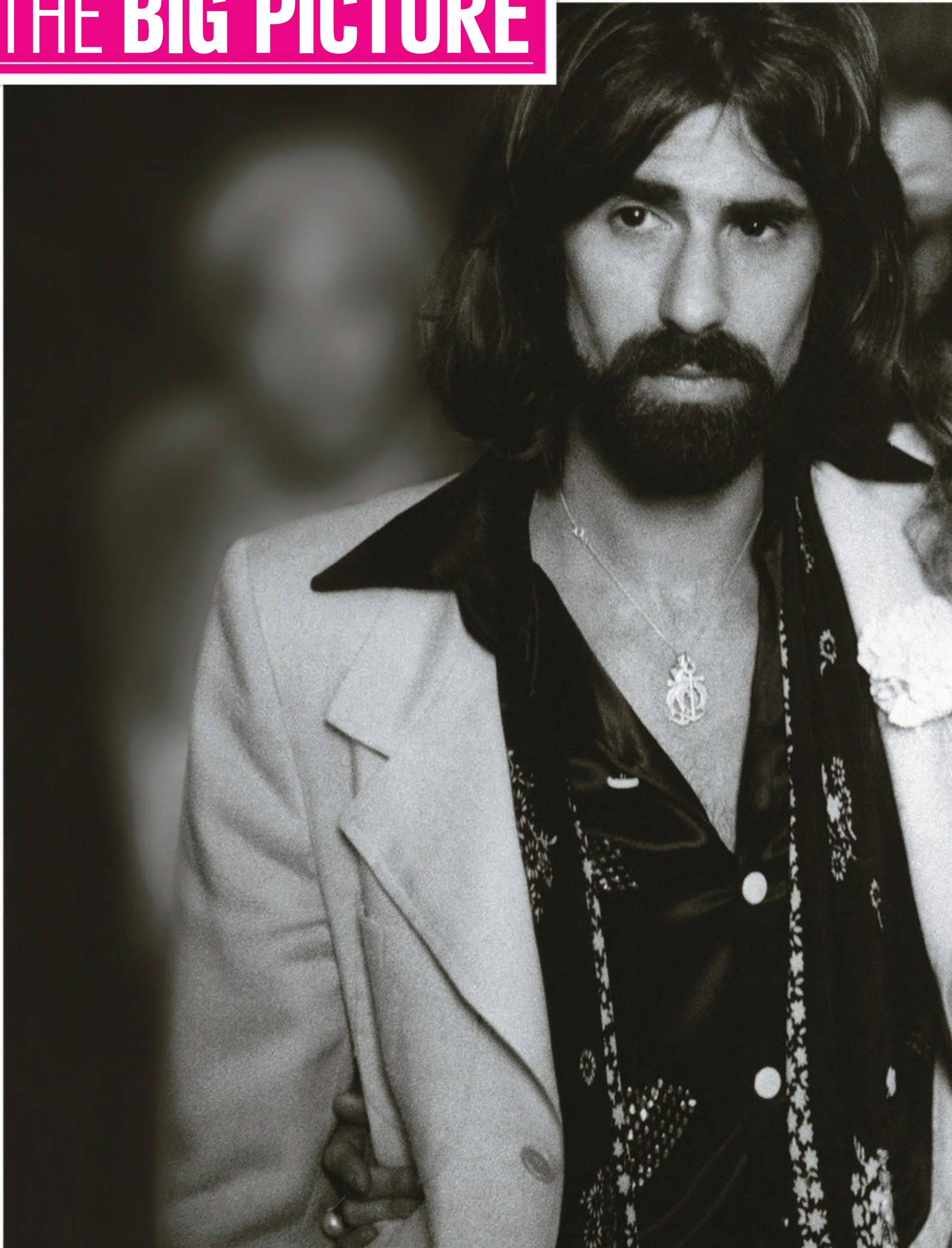

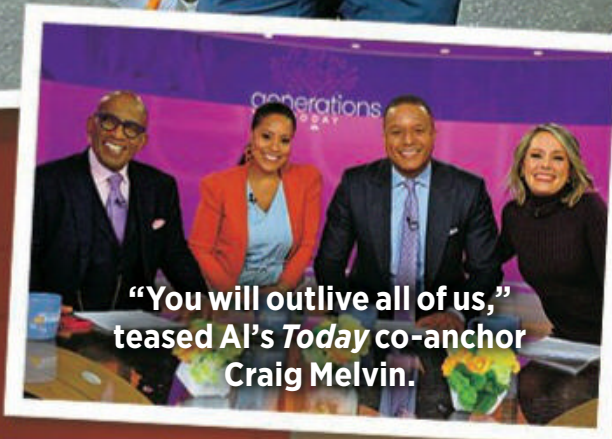
## PERFECT HARMONY

"I do about 100 grams of carbs a day and I walk," said the *Today* anchor, 67, who is participating in the show's 30-day walking challenge. Al's benefiting from those daily strolls in other ways, too. "Exercise, and not extreme exercise, [also] improves your mental health." Of course, this isn't the first time Al has opened up about his weight. In 2002, he underwent gastric bypass surgery after years of unsuccessful dieting. He dropped more than 100 pounds and continues to work hard at keeping healthy and fit — including sessions with a personal trainer. "I have setbacks and struggle every day," says Al, "but I never forget how far I've come."

Princess Charlotte was sweet on Mum's idea of baking cupcakes for a Platinum Jubilee street party on June 5.



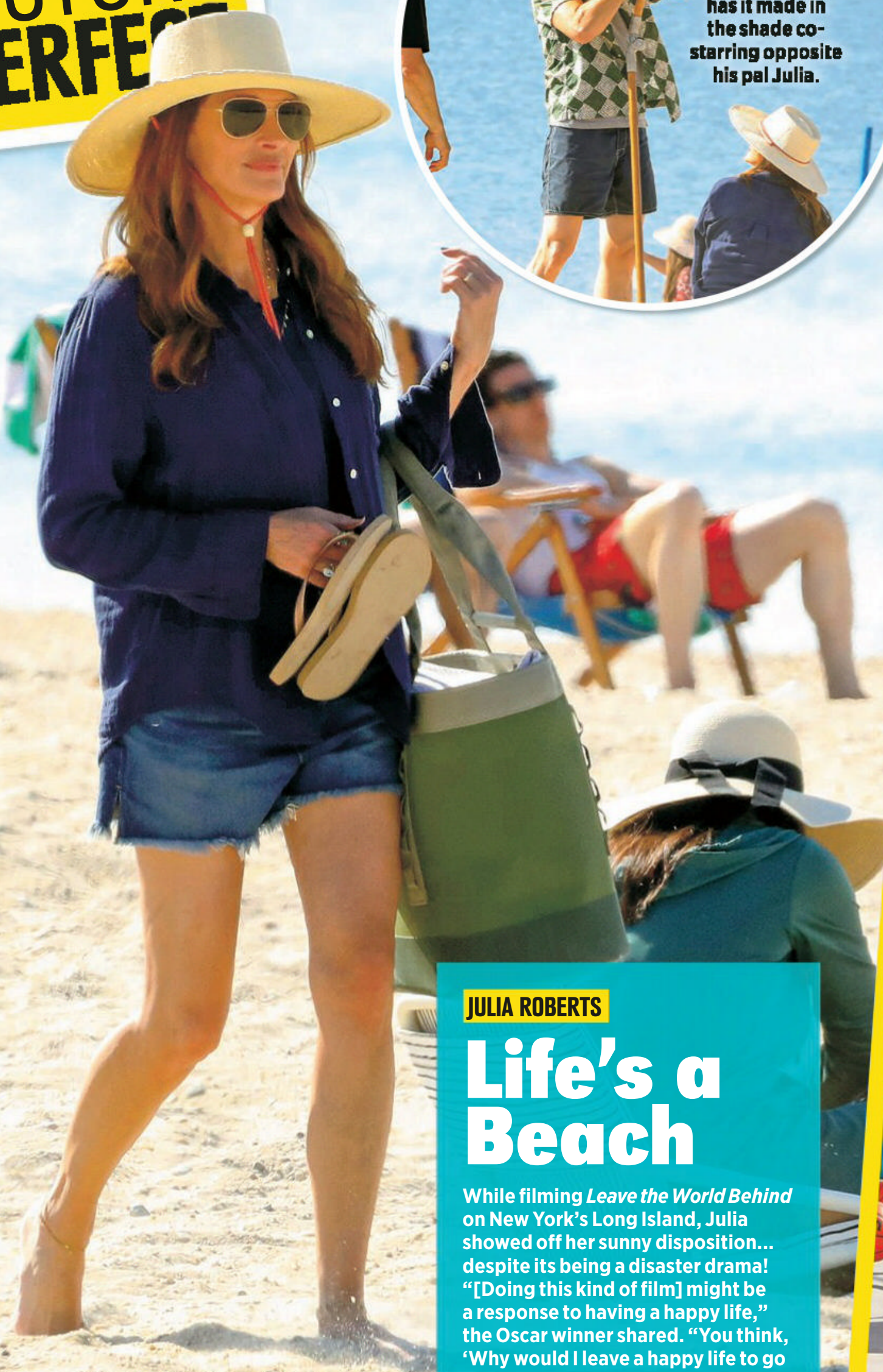

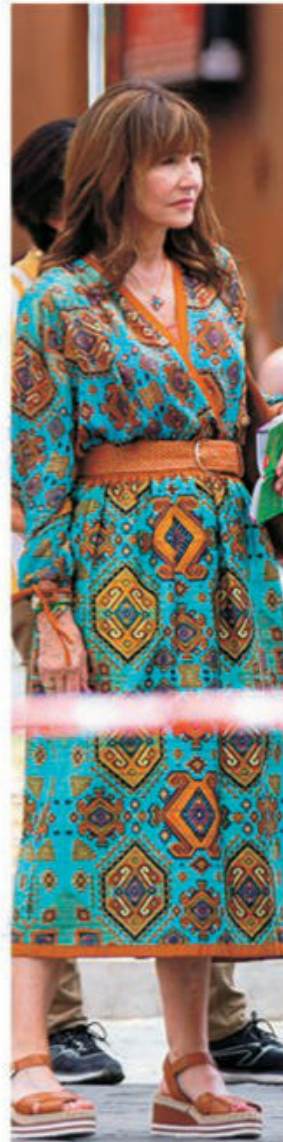

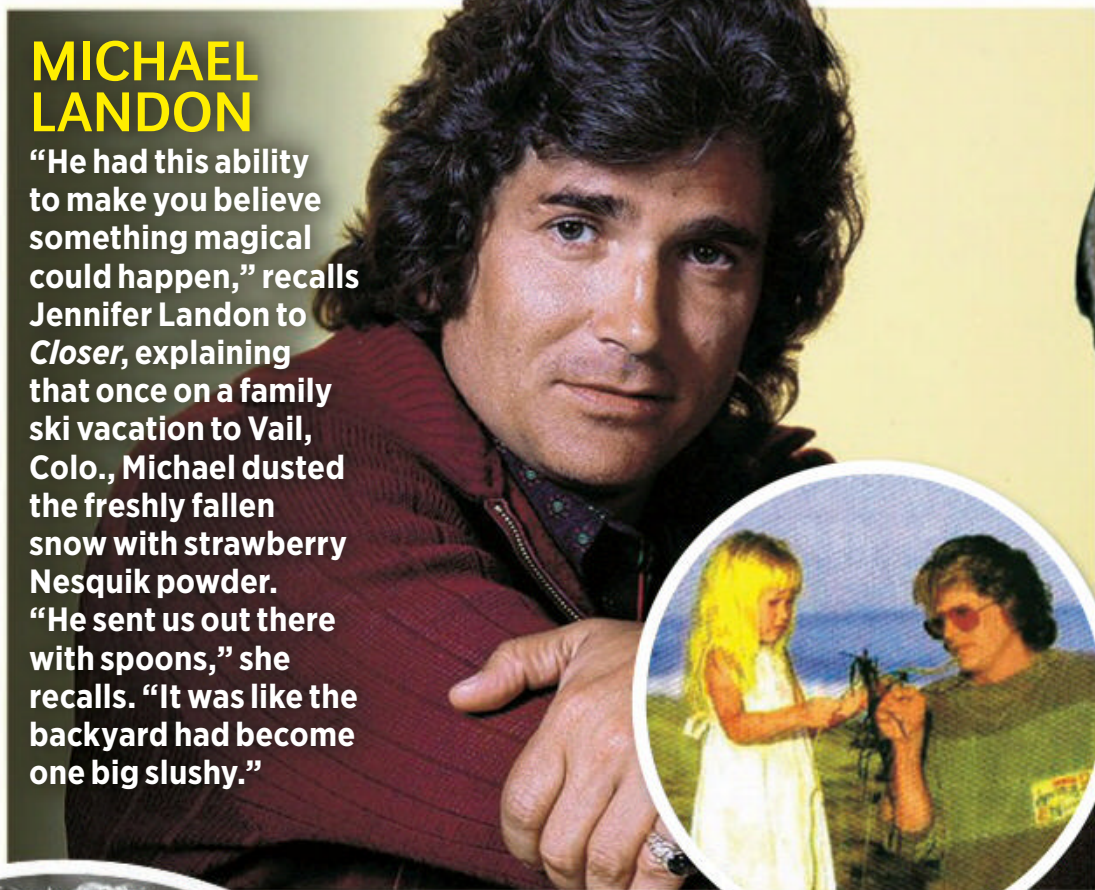


## GARY COOPER

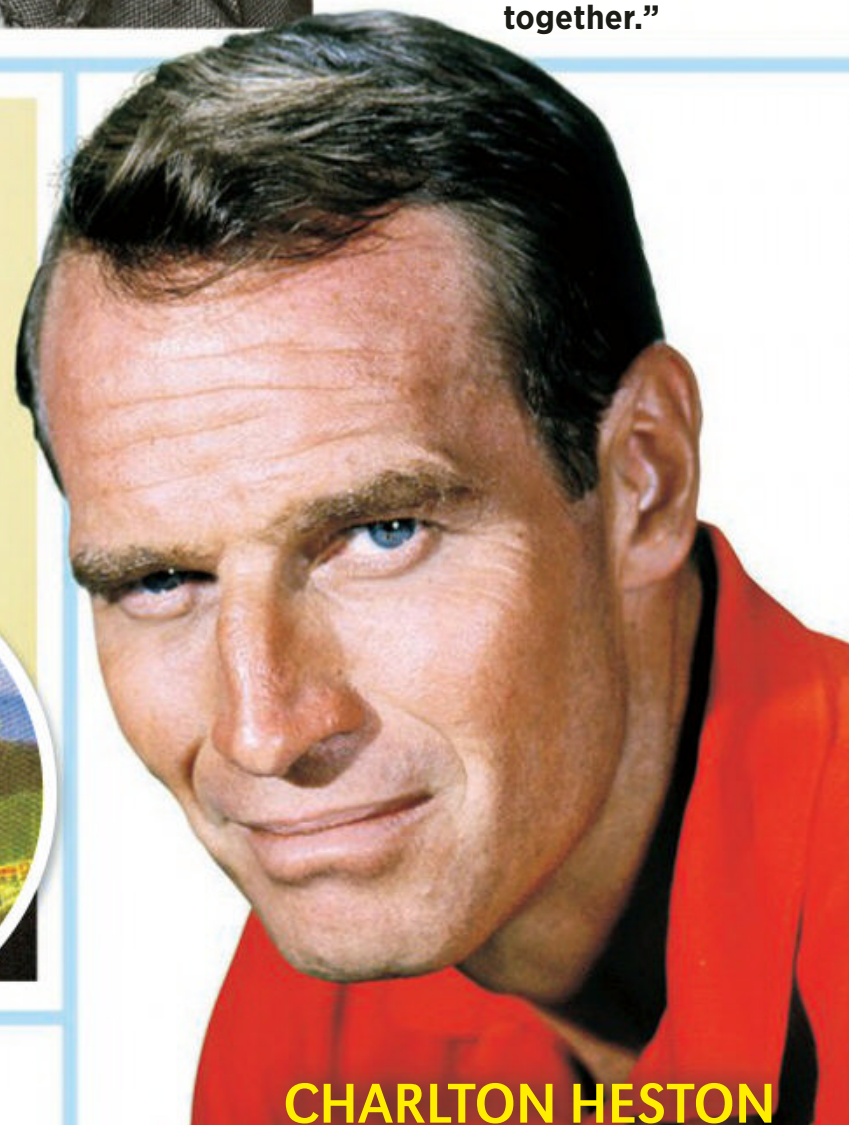
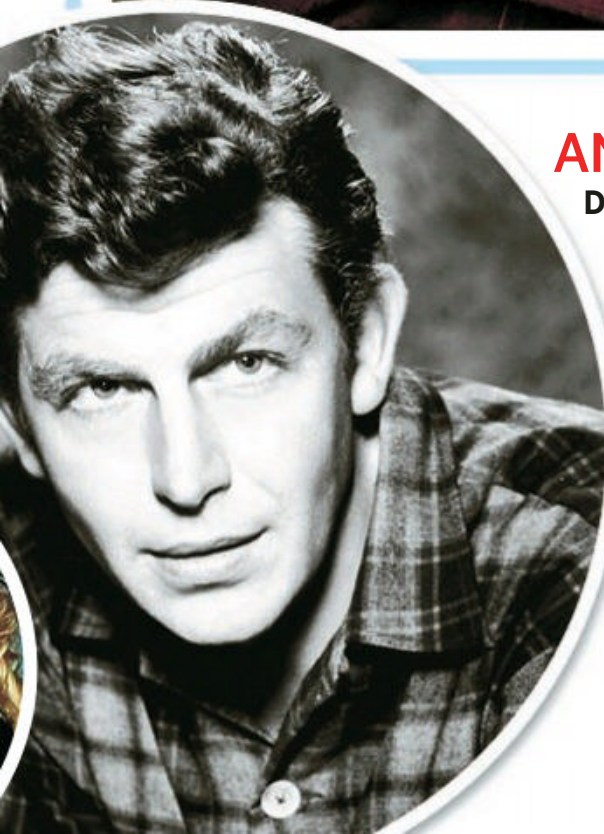
## MICHAEL LANDON

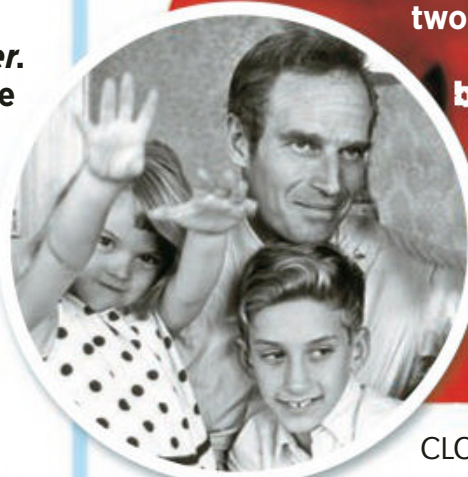
## ANDY GRIFFITH

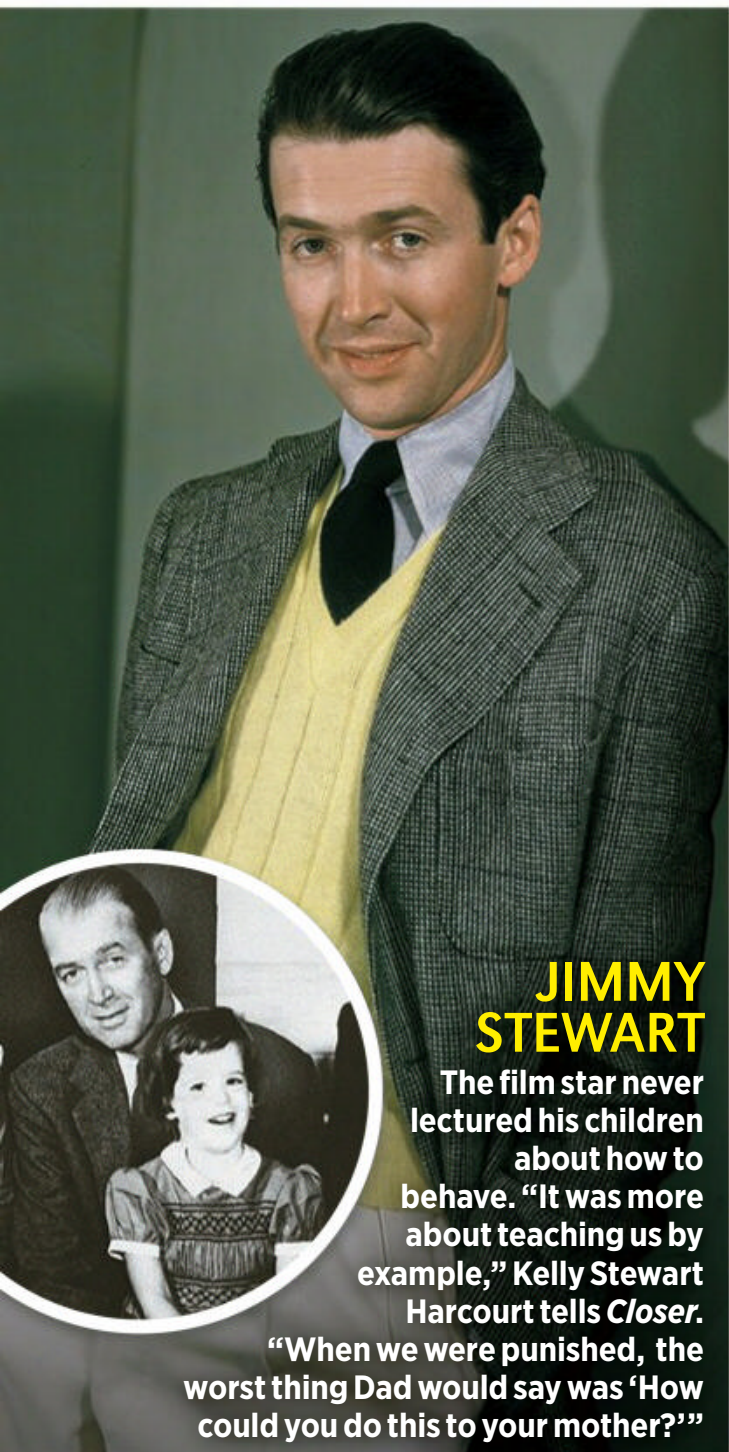






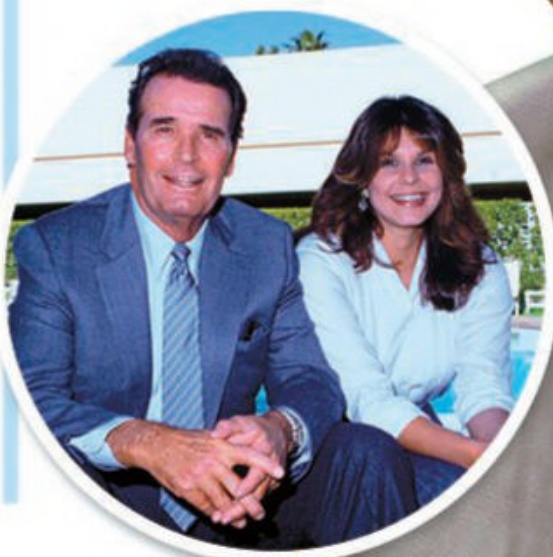
## CARY GRANT

"At the time ... I was embarrassed, I think, by the extent of his love and devotion to me. So I just sort of ran up and got the candy and gave him a hug and left," she recalls. "For the last 20 years of his life, I was given the extraordinary privilege to experience the full, vital passion of his heart."**

**"He was the type of father who got down on the floor and played with you," Gigi Garner tells *Closer* about *The Rockford Files* star. Jim also didn't hesitate to act when an earthquake hit their family home. "Everything started really shaking. I was scared to death," she recalls. # A True

THE LEGENDARY PERFORMER

**L**ena Horne knew how to make an entrance. “When I met her, she was wearing a baggy white suit, very stylish but voluminous, and a white cap and big glasses,” James Gavin, author of *Stormy Weather: The Life of Lena Horne*, tells *Closer*. “This getup could not begin to conceal the magnificence of Lena Horne. This woman gave off sparks.”

The singer and actress, who died at 92 in 2010, spent her life sparking inspiration around the world. Hailing from a privileged but troubled family, she was both aided and hampered by her beauty and grappled with racism in Hollywood. Along the way, she broke barriers, becoming the first African American to appear on the cover of a movie magazine, winning multiple awards and continuing to perform well into the 1990s. “Lena gave everyone a sense that they could age beautifully,” Gavin says. “That they could conquer the world, that no problem was too big to somehow

In 1942, she made her film debut in *Panama Hattie* and became the first Black actress to sign a long-term studio contract.

## SHE NEVER GAVE UP

Lena grew up longing for love. Born in Brooklyn, her father left when she was 3 and she was mostly raised by her grandparents. “I really never had a mother,” said Lena, whose mom, Edna, was gone for long periods. “She went to work as an entertainer with a Black stock company, and...she didn’t allow my father to be with me. I wanted both, and I couldn’t have either.”

Harlem’s Cotton Club hired Lena at 16 as a chorus girl, but her beauty only got her so far. “I was not musical at all,” she admitted. “I picked up something from every musician I worked with.”

She learned tough lessons in love, too. Her first marriage, to Louis Jordan Jones, gave her two children but ended in divorce.

She later thought she’d found her soulmate in Billy Strayhorn, a composer and Duke Ellington collaborator, but he was gay. “We would end and start each other’s sentences,” she recalled. “I wanted to marry Billy.”

He became a mentor, and before long, Hollywood called. Lena starred in such films as *Cabin in the Sky*, an all-Black musical, and *Stormy Weather*, from which she took her signature song. But racism held her back — because of Jim Crow laws, her scenes were often cut in the South. “No one bothered to put me in a movie where I talked to anybody, where some thread of the story might be broken if I were cut,” she said.

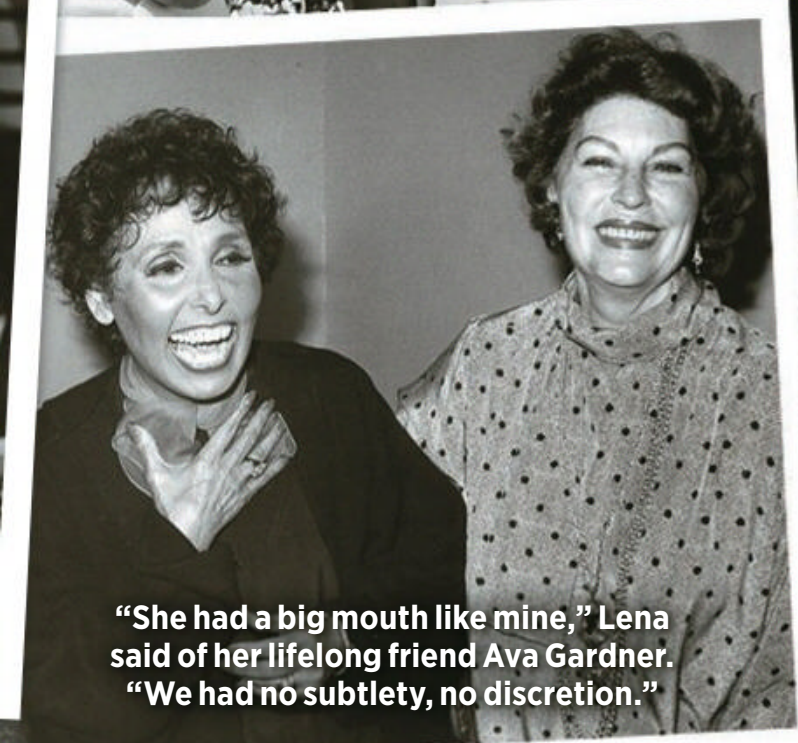
In 1947, she wed MGM music director Lennie Hayton, who was white because, she said, “he could get me into places no Black manager could.” Eventually, her practical marriage also became a love match. During that time, she quit Hollywood, returned to live performing and took up the civil rights cause. “I was always battling the system,” Lena said. “I wouldn’t work for places that kept us out.

It was a damn fight... everywhere I worked.”

She never stopped fighting, and despite the ground she broke, never felt like it was enough. “I was never able to enjoy this damn thing,” she said of fame. “My life has been about surviving. Along the way, I also became an artist. It’s an interesting journey. One in which music became my refuge and then my salvation.”

- ½** cup half-and-half
- 1½** cups heavy cream
- 15** chocolate sandwich cookies

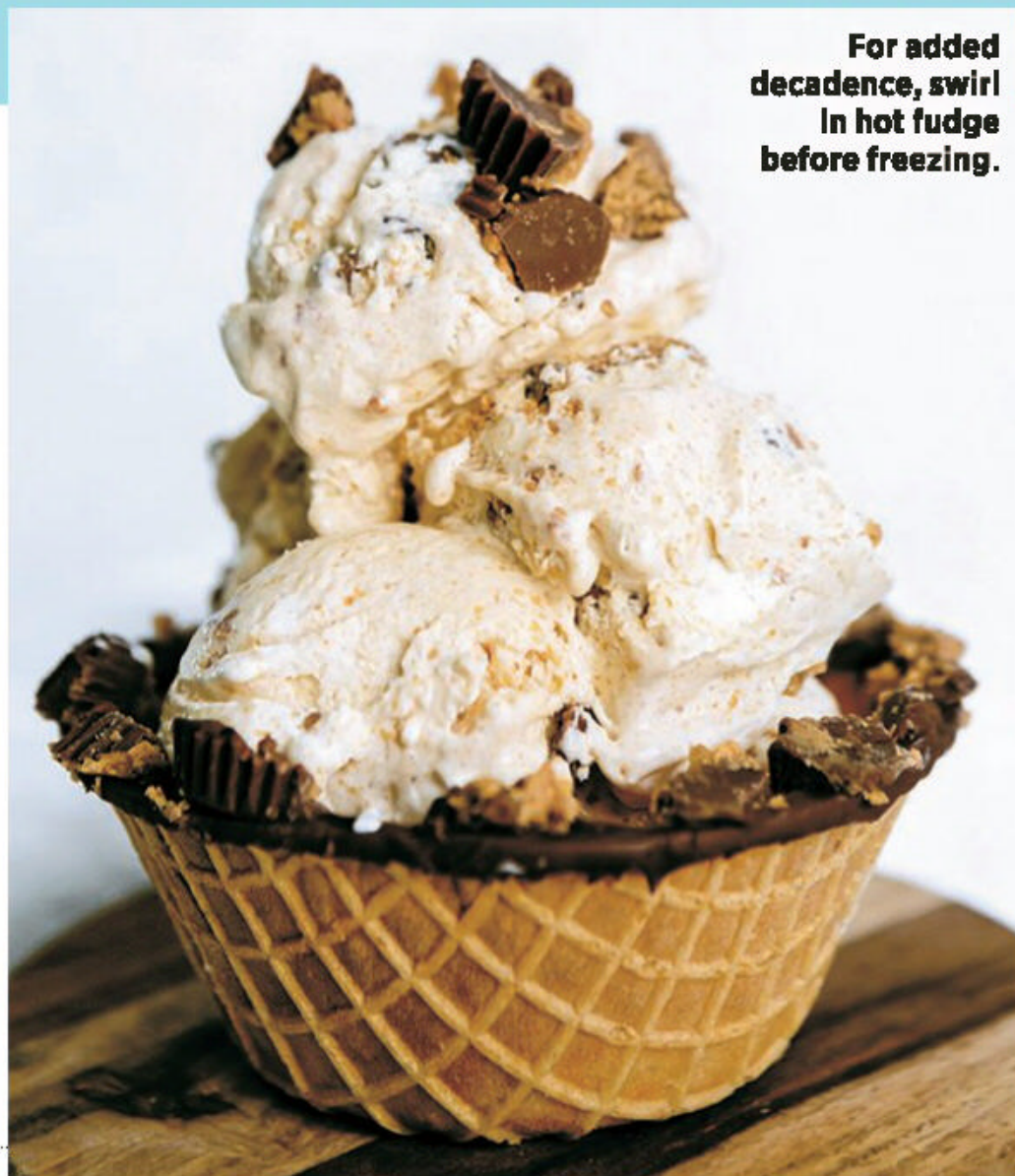

**3.** Pour ice cream into an 8 x 8" baking pan, and using your spatula, spread evenly throughout the pan. Freeze ice cream uncovered 3 to 5 hrs. or overnight, until firm. Cover any leftovers with tinfoil or plastic wrap and store in the freezer for up to 3 weeks.

For added decadence, swirl in hot fudge before freezing.

## LOADED PEANUT BUTTER CUP

Serves 14

- 1 (14 oz.) can sweetened condensed milk
- 2 tsp. pure vanilla extract
- $\frac{1}{3}$  cup all-natural, no-sugar-added creamy peanut butter
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup half-and-half
- $1\frac{1}{2}$  cups heavy cream
- 30 mini peanut butter cups

**1.** In a bowl, whisk sweetened condensed milk, vanilla, peanut butter and half-and-half until smooth. Set aside. With a standing or hand mixer, whip heavy cream until stiff peaks form, 60 to 90 sec. Fold condensed

milk mixture into cream until smooth.

**2.** Unwrap mini peanut butter cups. Place in a large plastic bag and seal it. Gently roll a rolling pin over to crush them into chunks or crush by hand. Evenly stir peanut butter cups into ice cream mixture.

**3.** Pour ice cream into an 8 x 8" baking pan, and using your spatula, spread evenly throughout pan.

Freeze uncovered 3 to 5 hrs. or overnight, until firm. Cover any leftovers with tinfoil or plastic wrap and store in the freezer up to 3 weeks.

**PER SERVING:** 217 cal, 5g protein, 21g carbs, 13g fiber, 19g sugar, 13g fat



You can also freeze these bars in ice cream bar molds if you have them.

## DOUBLE DARK CHOCOLATE CHIP BARS

Makes 14

- 1 (14 oz.) can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 tbsp. pure vanilla extract
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup half-and-half
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup dark cocoa powder
- $1\frac{1}{2}$  cups dark chocolate chips
- $1\frac{1}{2}$  cups heavy cream

**1.** In a bowl, whisk sweetened condensed milk, vanilla and half-and-half until smooth. Stir in cocoa powder. Gently stir in chocolate chips. Set aside.

**2.** With a standing or hand mixer, whip heavy cream until stiff peaks form, 60 to 90 sec. Fold condensed

milk mixture into cream until smooth.

**3.** Line a 9 x 13" baking dish with parchment paper (ensuring that you leave a little hanging over the edge so you can remove it as 1 unit). Pour the ice cream into the dish and freeze. Once the ice cream is set, remove by lifting the parchment paper. Cut into equal rectangles, push sticks through the ends and freeze the bars uncovered 3 to 5 hrs. or overnight. Work in small batches here, as you don't want the ice cream to melt as you go.

**PER SERVING:** 252 cal, 5g protein, 29g carbs, 2g fiber, 25g sugar, 14g fat



# 5 WAYS TO PREVENT HAIR LOSS

FOLLOW THESE SIMPLE STEPS FOR LONG, LUSCIOUS LOCKS

**WASH DOWN:** “Hair that’s thinning or falling out is fragile and easily damaged,” says the American Academy of Dermatology Association. So use a gentle shampoo to avoid stripping away needed moisture, then apply a moisturizing conditioner to coat the strands and reduce breakage.

**EASY DOES IT:** “Be gentle with your hair,” concur the folks at the Mayo Clinic. “Avoid tugging when brushing and combing, especially when your hair is wet. [Also] avoid harsh treatments such as hot rollers, curling irons, hot-oil treatments and permanents. Limit the tension on hair from styles that use rubber bands, barrettes and braids.”

**BE PRO PROTEIN:** Not getting enough protein each day can lead to not enough hair growth. “You need 40 to 60 grams a day,” says Dr. Wilma Bergfeld, a dermatologist with the Cleveland Clinic. An easy way to start is by working in beans and legumes, eggs or Greek yogurt into your diet.

**GET YOUR VITAMINS:** “A number of nutrients are required for optimal hair health, including vitamins A, C, D and E, zinc, B vitamins, iron, biotin, protein and essential fatty acids,” says Dr. Sara Kayat of U.K.’s *This Morning*. To get them, try a supplement. Celebs like Jennifer Aniston rave about Viviscal, which also contains deep-sea fish proteins.

**DON’T STRESS:** “Stress can cause the hair to stop growing and cause excessive shedding,” explains NYC dermatologist Dr. Michele Green. “It can also cause an autoimmune response where the body’s immune system attacks the hair follicles, resulting in hair loss.” A little yoga or meditation as well as getting more sleep may just help combat that.



Try meditation or a supplement such as Viviscal (\$27.64; amazon.com) to help reduce hair loss and keep your strands healthy.

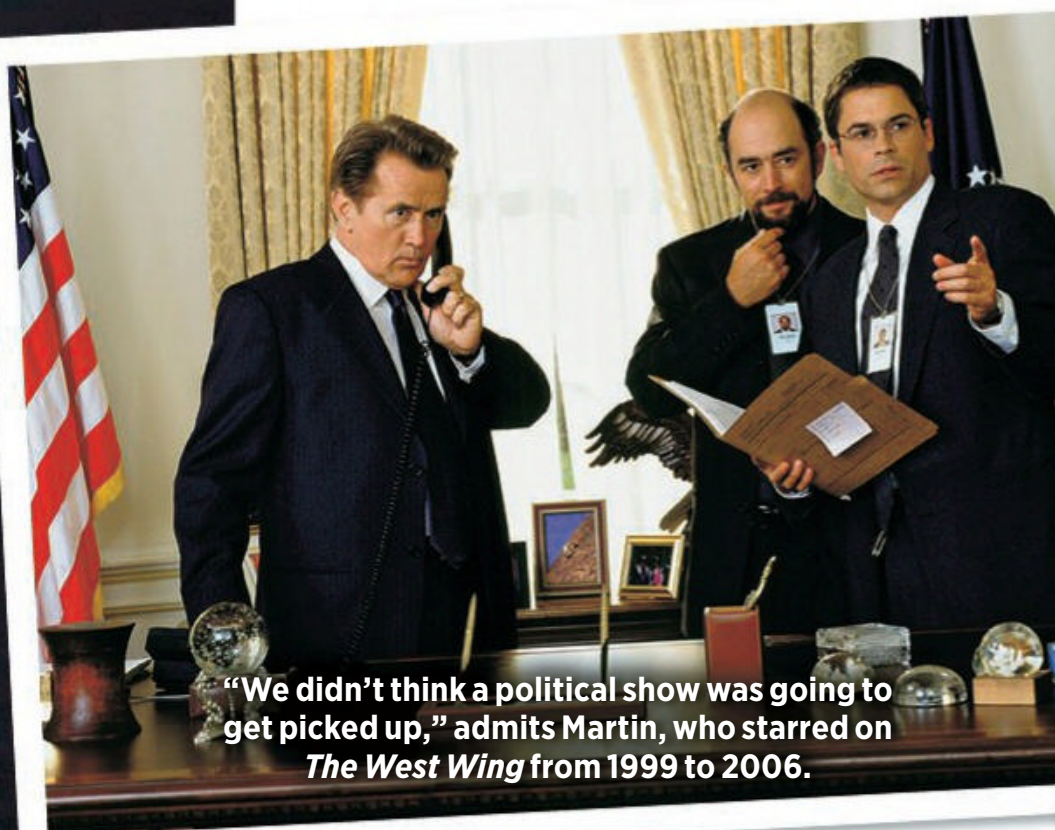

# *My Biggest* **INSPIRATION**

*The showbiz veteran shares thoughts about his background, family and celebrated career*





**"We didn't think a political show was going to get picked up," admits Martin, who starred on *The West Wing* from 1999 to 2006.**



**Martin and Janet were married in 1961 and have four children together: Emilio, Ramon, Charlie and Renée.**

**I**n 1968, a young actor named Martin Sheen starred in a groundbreaking adaptation of *Hamlet* in New York City. Created by Free Shakespeare in the Park founder Joseph Papp, the show revolutionized the Bard's timeless tragedy with contemporary sensibilities and rock music. "Joe wanted to do a modern version of the play, but he also wanted to do a version that spoke to an audience that did not normally attend theater — let alone Shakespeare," Martin, 81, tells *Closer*. "So we sang and danced. It was called *Hamlet as a Happening* or *The Naked Hamlet*. It was one of the greatest experiences I've ever had in the theater."

Martin went on to find great success in films, including *Badlands* and *Apocalypse Now*, and on television, where he played U.S. President Josiah Bartlet on *The West Wing*. He's also proud to share his memories on *American Masters: Joe Papp in Five Acts*, a new star-studded PBS documentary that premiered June 3. "To be a part of that theater and to have known Joe at an amazing time — it's the highlight of my life in the theater," Martin says. Check your local PBS station for additional air dates.

#### **How much time did you spend in New York City doing theater?**

I was in New York as a youngster starting in 1959, and I was there for 10 years. Jan and I met there, were married there, and all our children were born there. Those 10 years were vital in my life as a husband, father, an activist and an actor.

#### **What did you enjoy most about your theater days?**

Athletes have this phrase, "We're not going to leave anything off the field." That's the way I felt about theater. I never left anything off the stage. Joe inspired you to do the most outrageous things. You'd come into rehearsal every day excited.

#### **What was Joe Papp like as a person?**

He was very disarming. He had this godlike reputation, but he was the most down-to-earth, common man. He still had a Brooklyn accent, and he was a street fighter. He was very much a protector of the arts and artists — he hated bullies — so he was a man after my own heart. He was a great inspiration to me to follow my heart and conscience in life, not just in theater.

#### **What first inspired you to pursue acting?**

As a teenager, summer stock productions came to my hometown, Dayton, Ohio, every summer. That was my only connection to professional theater. And I grew up going to the movies.

#### **You loved the movies.**

Sure, I would go to the movies and be enthralled. One of my idols was James Dean. I never felt that I *became* an actor, I *was* an actor. I had a sense that I knew how to do what they were doing up on the screen. I couldn't articulate it. I finished

high school and left almost immediately for New York.

## Is it true that your father didn't want you to go into show business?

You couldn't blame him. Both my parents were immigrants. My father was from Spain, and my mother was from Ireland. My real name is Ramón Estévez. My father was very practical. He was a factory worker for most of his adult life, and he wanted me to go to college and improve my chances of making a better living than he did. We had some very, very painful confrontations about it.

## How did you get your way?

He was a big fan of TV westerns in the '50s. One night, we started a discussion about my going to New York. He said to me, "You want to go into the theater. You can't sing, you can't dance. You don't know what you're doing!" I said, "Pop, you sit here every night watching westerns — do you see anyone singing or dancing?" He said, "No, but you don't ride a horse either." He finally saw that I was committed and realized it would be a life and death struggle with me if I didn't pursue it. When I got ready to go, he blessed me, and he continued to bless me the rest of his life. I adored him.

## Did you object to your own children going into acting?

No, but I honestly have to say I wasn't

aware of it. I was so self-involved and trying to be a provider that I wasn't aware of their inclination to being actors. I was doing a show one time, and Emilio showed up. I thought he was there to visit me, but he'd gotten a part in the same show. The only influence I had on Emilio was to keep his name. When he started out, his agent was advising him to change his name to Sheen and he wouldn't do it. And I thank God he didn't.

## Were you sorry you changed yours?

That's one of my regrets. I never changed my name officially. It's still Ramón Estévez on my birth certificate. It's on my marriage license, my passport, driver's license. Sometimes you get persuaded when you don't have enough insight or even enough courage to stand up for what you believe in, and you pay for it later. But, of course, I'm only speaking for myself.

## What do you consider your big break?

Oh gosh. I considered it a big break just to get a job! "Oh, someone's going to pay me for this?" I'd do it for nothing. Don't let anyone know, but I'd still do it for nothing!

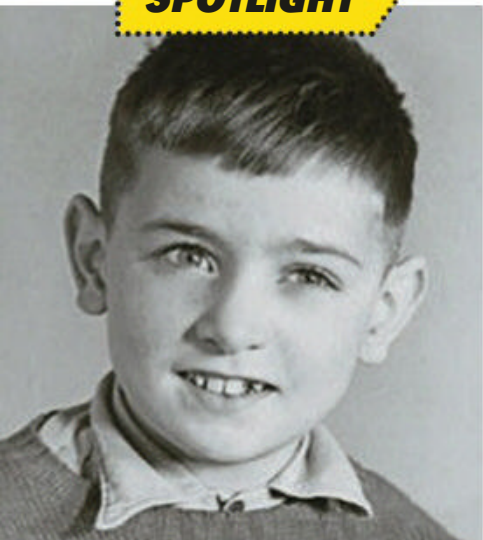

I still get letters from people who are just discovering it, and a lot of young people were inspired to go into public life because of it. The blessings were just endless with that show, and they’re still coming.

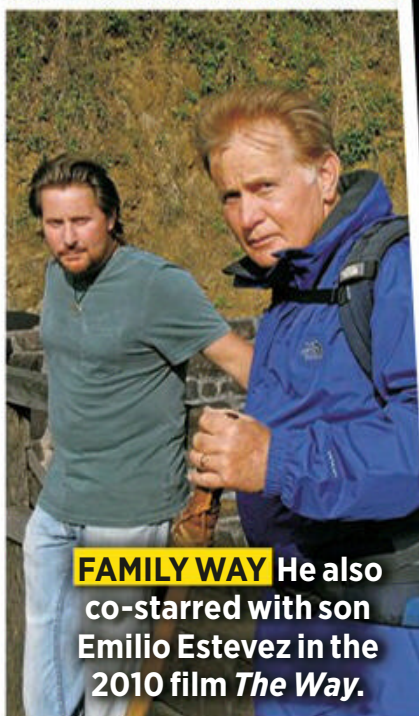
**Do you have any other favorite roles?**

The one that fills me with the deepest gratitude and satisfaction is called *The Way*. We made it in Spain about the pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela and dedicated it to my father, who was from Galicia. It was written, directed and starred my son Emilio Estevez. It is the best thing I’ve ever done. Thousands of people have seen the film and been inspired to do the pilgrimage. That is a great source of satisfaction and pride.

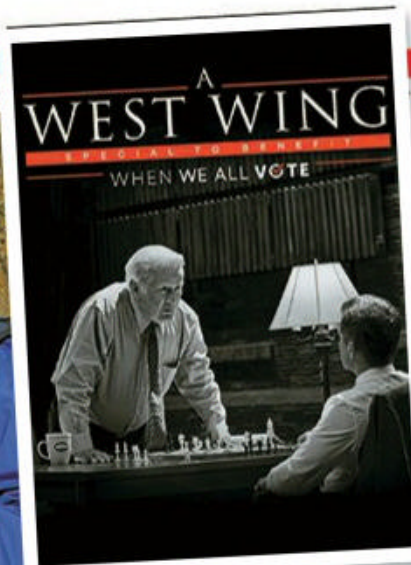

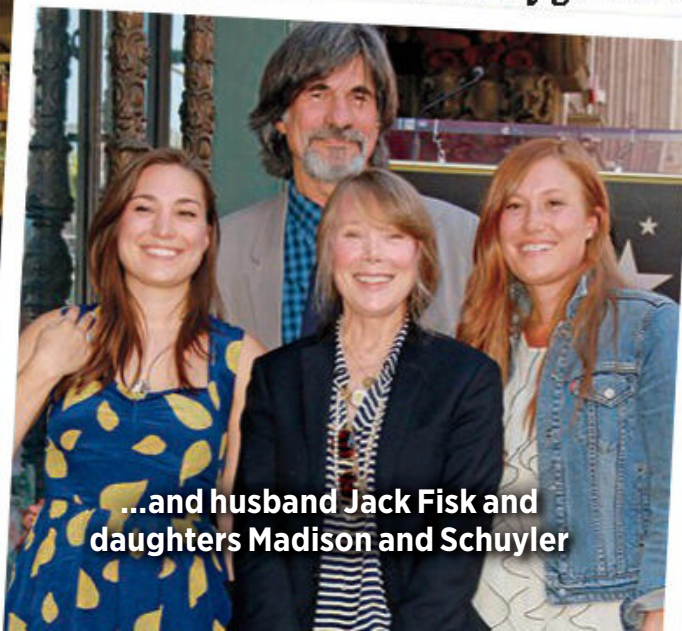

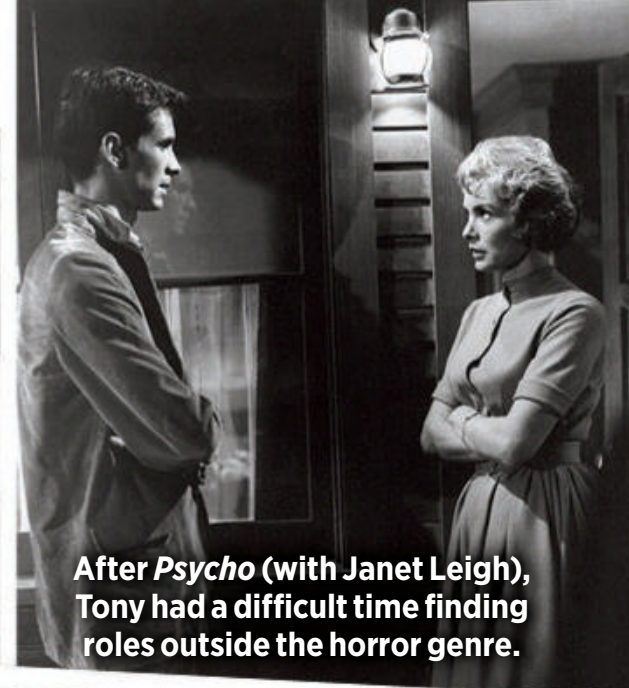
**I**n 1958, Anthony Perkins was set to become Hollywood's biggest heartthrob. Touted as "the hottest property in motion pictures," he drew comparisons to James Dean, Marlon Brando and Elvis Presley. But the handsome, 6-foot-2 actor downplayed the praise. "If you're the number one star, you can't go anywhere except to be the number two star," he said. "It gives you a kind of point of no return in your career where you could possibly never achieve anything more."

Two years later, Tony played the role of *Psycho*'s Norman Bates, one of Hollywood's most indelible villains. "People couldn't look at him the same way," Charles Winecoff, author of *Split Image: The Life of Anthony Perkins*, tells *Closer*. As much as Hollywood had tried to paint him as a romantic lead, Tony's intensely independent spirit — and complicated personal life that included a secret romance with fellow big-screen hunk Tab Hunter — didn't fit the traditional mold. "He was really his own person," says Winecoff. "He doesn't fall into any categories. Whatever his struggles were, he's just unique."

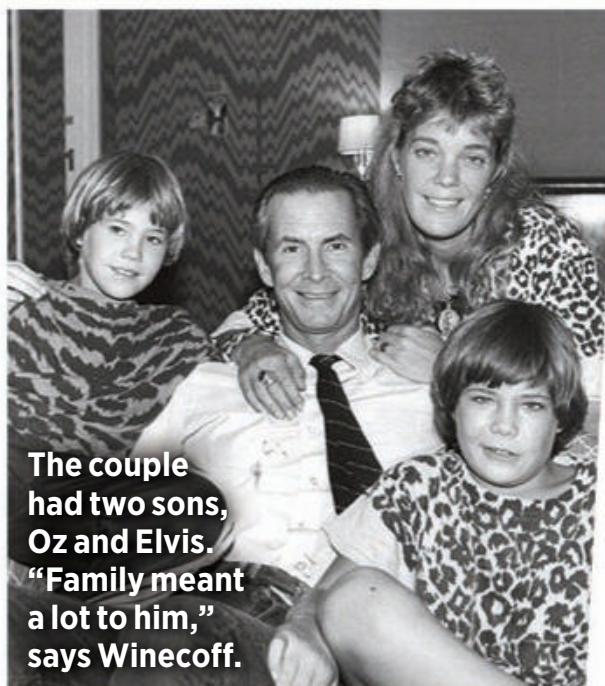
Struggle was part of Tony's life from a very early age. His father, actor Osgood Perkins, died of a heart attack when Tony was 5, devastating him. He was raised in Manhattan by his mother, Janet, and they "became abnormally close," mirroring the relationship Norman Bates had with his mother. The actor later hinted that Janet was prone to inappropriate displays of affection. Acting gave him an escape from the sorrow and confusion of his young life. "There was nothing about me I wanted to be," Tony said. "I felt wonderfully happy being someone else."



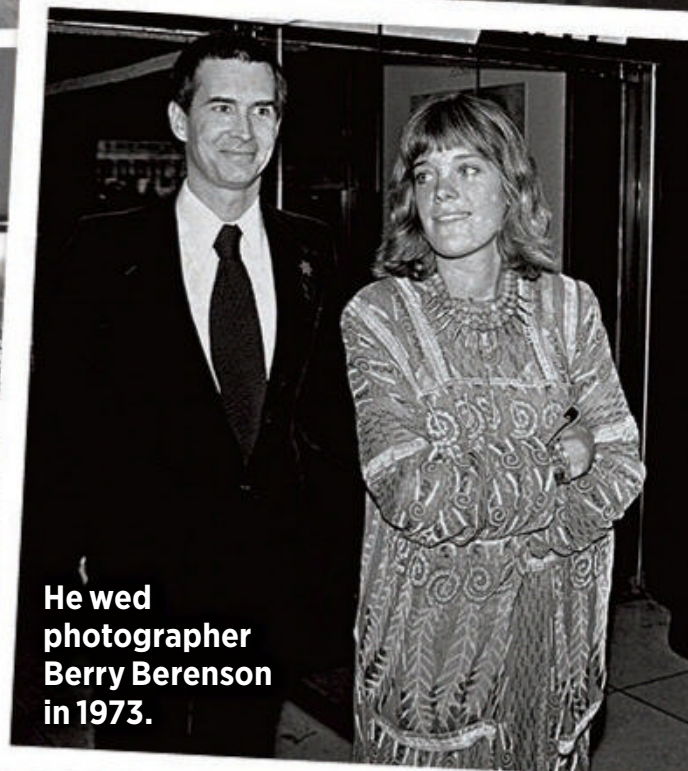
Tony received an Oscar nomination for his role in 1956's *Friendly Persuasion*, with Dorothy McGuire and Gary Cooper.

He followed in his father's footsteps, rising to fame in *Friendly Persuasion* and other films before checking into the Bates Motel in 1960. The role made him a sensation but came at a high price: After *Psycho*, Hollywood only wanted him to play more monsters. "People don't usually think of me for comedies," he said, "and I do like doing comedy." At one point, he went two years without working.

## FINDING HIS WAY

His personal life was also very complex. Tony often had relationships with men and dated dancer Grover Dale for several years. In those days, no one discussed their sexuality, but many were surprised by his 1973 marriage to actress and photographer Berry Berenson. The union produced two sons, Oz and Elvis, and seemed to have a good effect

on Tony. "Ever since I got married and had kids, my life became much more structured and ordinary," marveled the actor, who took pride in his family. "He was devoted to them," adds Winecoff. The actor remained married to Berry until his death from an AIDS-related illness in 1992 at age 60.

Tony believed in going his own way. The second half of his career was filled with many supporting character roles that he could happily disappear into. He also returned to play Norman Bates in two big-screen sequels, the latter of which he directed. "I think *Psycho* is one of the things that's given me longevity in this business," Tony said. "I would have hated to disappear like so many actors in the '50s did.... I'm still here. That's all I know." —Lisa Chambers, with reporting by Katie Bruno

You can never stop thinking about that other shoe dropping.” However, as he worked his way to college, then to the stage, film and stardom on TV, it was an all-too-real penchant for alcohol that he’d fear the most. “I had a 30-year run and, at the end, I didn’t care about anything.” Now sober for 15 years, John, who turned 70 on June 20, has an outlook where the past is merely prologue. “I look forward to getting up in the morning. I look forward to doing new things...I’m looking forward to the rest of my life.”

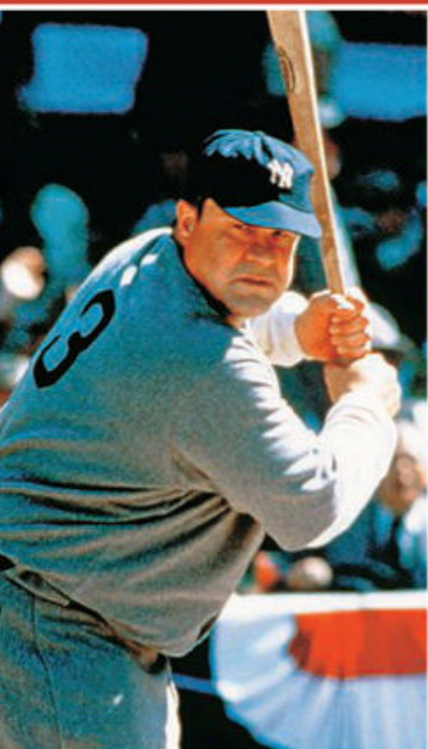
**1988 A GUY THING**
